I often receive questions in our **We're Listening** box. I hope you don't mind me answering a few here.

"Why is the East Entrance closed?"

First and Foremost, the safety of Library staff and patrons is extremely important to the Library Board of Trustees and myself. Unfortunately, it is a safety risk for Library staff to have people enter without their knowledge or sight. This entrance is also not designed to be accessible to patrons with disabilities.
